The oldest known modern design in cast iron: Hans Christiansen ca. 1910.



Originally marked with CH and probably not made in cast iron! Also found with other markings from foundry schools, even a Dutch one: Werkspoor! And a German one: Giesserei Institut (Foundry Institute) Aachen!

# Oisin Kelly for Kilkenny Design, by Waterford Iron Founders Ireland.





Man and woman + two men, two designs of 1967.

Still a riddle from the sixties: a range of candleholders with accent of trees and branches. The only fact I know, they are from an Austrian designer, name unknown. The two pictured ones are often attributed to

Horst Dalbeck because they have a label with his name, but I could prove they are not. You can find them perfect cast and finished by polishing in bronze. Horst Dalbeck has a bronze foundry, mainly for funeral bronzes as lanterns, ornaments and wreaths. In my collection I have both candle holders in cast iron and in bronze, the bronze one marked by Horst Dalbeck. The cast iron holders are larger, ca 5 mm so the bronze ones are copies.




2010 he designed the IKEA 8: Snövita holder for 2 different candles. This one is in shape the same as the Giltig candle holder.




